Thanks very much for your wonderful information. My heart jumped with joy upon receiving your email. Indeed there is high need for this kind of assistance in the villages we operate our literacy programs. Most of the people in those villages lack basic medical facilities and at the same time do not have money to pay for those facilities even if they are available.

Their earning power is so low that they prefer to use traditional medicines to cure their headaches, fever, pains etc. As for pregnant women, they use old cloths or rags to rap their babies and so on.

My wife is currently running a voluntary service in one health centre after graduating from her three-year nursing training program. Hopefully, she can be one of the people that can help with the distribution of those items to the poor people.
