

Ardith Pollex, Chairman of Medical Missions writes:

This letter comes from Bible Translators in Papua New Guinea. The medical supplies we sent have arrived in time to be of help and are much appreciated.

Dear Ardith and Medical Missions Workers,

I think you are on my newsletter list and know that I recently spent time in Australia and had back surgery. Due to this, I was not able to be 'online' too much at that time. It still limits my sitting time and therefore my working on the computer time. But, I am slowly catching up with things.

Some time while I was away, one of your precious boxes arrived. It came from Kitchener and the number on it was CC105638937CA. While we were away, some of the other missionaries here needed a couple layettes and were able to get them just in time when the box came so that was great.

We have a new young man working at our Aidpost (clinic) here on the Nobonob mountain. His name is Francis and he is always so thankful to get the bandages and gauze. There seems to be less and less money getting to the local clinics here in PNG these days so your parcels have really been a special blessing to him and the people here on the mountain. We hope to go to the clinic and get some pictures to send to you of him there. It is just a ways up the mountain and I'm still finding it a little hard to up hill with my back. I can go down okay, but if you go down, you still have to come back up so I'm not going too far afield very often.

A second box arrived just this week. The number on it is CC169141093CA and it, too, is from Kitchener. When the director of the training course who we live next to was in town this week, a gentleman from a neighboring language group came up to him and said "My wife is in the hospital and just had a baby. I don't want any money, but is it possible to get one of those baby bundles from you?" (Asking for money is very common here in PNG..) The director told him if he could find his way up to the centre, we would be able to give him one. So, your generosity and God's Hand of Love is reaching even farther than our little community here. What a blessing you all are for your willingness to give and help people so far away. Please know that your gifts and hard work really do touch lives. May the Lord continue to bless your ministry.
