

## GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- Replace the society name and place with that of your own society or zone.
- The dark gray is intended to indicate silver fabric. The light gray can be light gray or whatever colour you would prefer.
- To make the actual banner, enlarge each of the pieces by the same percent. A grid may be used or put them on an overhead transparency and project them at the size wanted.
- This banner is designed with three pieces—a larger centre piece with a smaller separate piece on each side.

### **Tips for lettering:**

- A sans serif font has been used to make the letters easier to work with.
- Trace the letters on a fusible product (e.g. Wonder-under or Steam-a-seam). The fusible product is then ironed onto the wrong side of the fabric to be used for the letters and cut out. Take care that you don't end up with a mirror image of the letters.
- They are now easy to iron in place on the background fabric.
- The letters then need to be secured with thread, such as with a blanket stitch by machine, as the fusible product is not permanent.

This process may also be used for attaching the other pieces of the design.
