MISSION GRANTS 2010-2013

Delegates at the district convention in Ottawa April 30 and May 1, 2010 accepted a work program for the upcoming triennium with \$14,500 for Mission Grants.

- \$1,500 - Reproducible Sunday school materials for Atlantic Canada
- \$3,000 - Student grants for full-time LCC workers
- \$4,000 - Pastoral visitation fund in Atlantic Canada
- \$2,000 - East District Mission Opportunities Fund
- \$2,500 - Resources for Haitian church workers
- \$1,500 - Summer preaching station, PEI
